

 - Low-cost textbook providers
 - Open+

The Impact of Open Educational Resources on Various Student Success Metrics

There are multiple indicators which suggest that completion, quality, and affordability are the three greatest challenges for higher education today in terms of students, student learning, and student success. Many colleges, universities, and state systems are seeking to adopt a portfolio of solutions that address these challenges. This article reports the results of a large-scale study (21,822 students) regarding the impact of course-level faculty adoption of Open Educational Resources (OER). Results indicate that OER adoption does much more than simply save students money and address student debt concerns. OER improve end-of-course grades and decrease DFW (D, F, and Withdrawal letter grades) rates for all students. They also improve course grades at greater rates and decrease DFW rates at greater rates for Pell recipient students, part-time students, and populations historically underserved by higher education. OER address affordability, completion, attainment gap concerns, and learning. These findings contribute to a broadening perception of the value of OERs and their relevance to the great challenges facing higher education today.

STATE INVESTMENTS

- CUNY & SUNY New York
 - \$8M invested to create 5,200 OER courses in 2017-2018
 - \$8M additional invested for 2019-2020
- North Dakota
 - \$107,250 invested in 2015
 - 650 OER courses developed

ACHIEVING THE DREAM

- OER Degree Initiative
 - Grants up to \$100k or \$300k with 25% match requirement
 - At least one OER degree (1 year or 2 year)
 - At least one section of course offered as OER
 - Use of Creative Commons Attribution License
- 38 colleges in 13 states participating



WHAT CAN ILLINOIS DO?

- Develop a statewide strategy with legislative & funding support
- Establish a repository strategy
- Identify OER connected to IAI courses
- Enhance CTE OER options and usage
- Develop OER-driven dual credit courses



WHAT CAN INSTITUTIONS DO?

- Develop institutional policy
- Align policy with institutional mission & strategic plan
- Include supports for sustainability
- Engage all stakeholders



WHAT CAN INSTITUTIONS DO?

- Set institutional goals
 - High impact courses
 - Measures of success
 - Realistic timelines
 - Establish data elements
 - Develop communication strategies
 - Long-term goal(s)



WHAT CAN INSTITUTIONS DO?

- Define emphasis areas
 - High quality materials
 - Accessible materials (disabilities & online)
 - Compliance with Creative Commons licensing & Intellectual Property laws
 - Establishing the open culture (developed content openly licensed & shared)



OPEN CULTURE

- University of British Columbia
- Evidence of educational leadership is required for tenure/promotion in the Educational Leadership stream... It can include, but is not limited to...Contributions to the practice and theory of teaching and learning literature, including publications in peer-reviewed and professional journals, conference publications, book chapters, textbooks and open education repositories/resources.
- Kwantlen Polytechnic University
- IP Policy change includes encouragement to submit work to KPU OA repository, consider Creative Commons licensing, create & adapt OER, publish in OA outlets, and adopt open science practices.



COLLEGE OF LAKE COUNTY

- Launched 2014 college-wide initiative
- 25 active OER courses & psychology department has over 50 OER sections each semester
- Identification in course registration system of low textbook cost classes (less than \$25), inclusive of OER


Look for the Open Educational Resources (OER) star or label when registering for classes on myCLC. The course material for these classes cost \$25 or less.




CARL SANDBURG COLLEGE

- Open Education Resource Course Initiative (OERCI)
- Purpose: support faculty in development and create student savings through reduced textbook requirements and increased textbook-free courses
- Built a faculty community, made it fun, incentivized
- Fall 2018 they had 105 OER sections and 1,129 students in OER courses.


